San Marcos's Annual Veteran's Day Parade To Honor Those Who Have Served

SAN MARCOS, November 3, 2016 – City residents will be honoring all those who have served at the annual Veteran's Day Parade, Saturday Nov. 5th in downtown San Marcos, starting with some free breakfast at 8:30am at the Hays County Courthouse lawn and followed by live entertainment leading up to the parade.

The parade will begin on Hopkins Street at the intersection of CM Allen and will travel toward the Courthouse. The parade will then turn left after passing the courthouse onto Guadalupe Street and then turn left onto San Antonio Street, continue traveling down and then turn left onto CM Allen Parkway. Last it will turn right onto Hopkins Street, making a return to the line-up area for disbanding.

Children are invited to join the Kiwanis Club Kids Bicycle Brigade! You can show your support for Veterans by decorating and riding your bike in the parade. There will be free decorating at the Courthouse lawn for the bikes and helmets where after you can join in as the Kiwanis Club members escort you into the parade. Ages 5 & older and bicycles, training wheels, and scooters are welcome. For more information, call Parks and Recreation at 512.393.8400. There will also be other kids activities surrounding the parade.

Veteran groups, bands, drill teams, civil clubs and all also more than welcome to march in the parade. All events mentioned surrounding the Veteran's Day Parade on Nov. 5th, are free to the public from 8:30am-12pm. San Marcos honors this annual event in show of appreciation to not only our local veterans but all those who have served.

The actual date for Veteran's Day this year is on Friday, November 11th, 2016. It is a public holiday to celebrate the anniversary of the end of World War 1 on November 11th and honors all US veterans, as well as victims of all wars. For example, making a mistake about the time an event starts is a 25-point deduction because those types of errors cause readers to loose faith – AND miss the event. If a name was spelled correctly throughout the story but incorrectly once, the point deduction is lower.
